UPDATE FROM LISA IN BULGARIA*

**We don't share Lisa's last name as Bulgaria is a sensitive country.*

“**T**his week I went to Turkey with some of the leaders from my first church plant. Our time in the car was spent talking about how to lead other Muslims to Jesus, how to do funerals that will be accepted by the Muslim community and carry the message of the Gospel. We planned a trip to visit their family members who they have led to Christ. My heart swells with pride when I see my spiritual children lead others to the Lord and gently lead them away from years of spiritual bondage.



I recently took refugees Moses and Samuel to give their testimonies at two ongoing church plants with nationals. The goal? To encourage former Muslims as they endure family and community pressure to return to Islam. Moses and Samuel were in the refugee

camp in Bulgaria; they come from Iran and Afghanistan. I was proud as they told their stories of endurance under persecution, imprisonment for seeking truth under Islamic regimes, and escaping for their lives. They prayed for the families, especially the men, to be strong and wise. In my upcoming newsletter I'll share more about these amazing men who have become servants of the Most High!

I have no words to say how I appreciate your love and support during these unprecedented times. I am ever thankful for you and pray the Lord blesses you beyond expectation. I continue to see fruit here in Bulgaria among Muslims. **I remind you this is also your fruit!**”

COVID 2020 is forever etched into our history books and into our consciousness. It was forced upon us without invitation. Our world went dark within 24 hours without a single question or discussion of alternatives. YES, our world has changed. Is COVID the only factor that caused all this change? Is our tendency to return to pre-Covid behaviors and strategies? What happens if people's pre-Covid mindset has changed? There will be no trophies for being the first to return to pre-Covid attendance and habits. Our real challenge is to understand what we have and how do we move forward?

The very first stage of change is what is called the "**Crystallization of Discontent**." This is the moment that you clearly understand we cannot keep doing what we have always done – Change is our future! Said another way, "*Until the pain of remaining the same is greater than the pain or change – nothing will never change!*"



So, what do you see when you examine your congregation, your town, your county, your school systems, homelessness, no counseling centers, broken family systems, after school tutoring, and on I could go. Are you discontent enough to become the agent of change?

Once discontent is awakened, the second stage of change is to **move toward preparation**. This is the moment that we accept responsibility to change our behavior. We evaluate and select the tools needed to preform new techniques. Plans are developed. A specific timeframe is set for this goal to be met (I.e., 6 months). New skills are acquired to meet this new challenge.

Stage three is that of **action**. Evaluations have concluded, a plan of action is set before us, tools and skills have been accessed. NOW is the time to self-direct behavioral change. We are now consciously engaged in new behaviors and goals to achieve. It is at this point that

our old unwanted behaviors are overcome. We do not go back to old methods and habits. Our enthusiasm and momentum move us forward in the direction of God's calling.

Understanding Stages of Change Personally

I want to circle back to my thoughts on the Crystallization of Discontent. The Leadership role is not merely implementing new initiatives. Understand that we as leaders are Dealers in Hope! In conjunction to this is that we are willing to *embrace our inadequacies*. We all work hard to remain blind to our inadequacies. One of the great works of God is that he helps us come to terms with these inadequacies – yes it will be painful, but we are not just leading another program, we are in the life change business. It is only when we embrace our weaknesses that He can become strong in us.

When is the last time that you *truly sought God in new ways*? What is one thing that you can change slightly to bring about a greater return in your private devotions. I am not asking about the latest and greatest methodologies from the spiritual pundits of our time. I am asking you to take a closer evaluation of how you seek God. What is stale? What is fresh? When you see the magnitude of God in fresh ways, your visions and dreams begin to change.

Rededicate to a life of prayer. A fresh intentionality in the context of our prayer life is needed. We have all experienced something vastly different – never seen at this level. Stale prayer and old habits are inadequate to meet today's prophetic challenges. We are witnessing a dress rehearsal for the end of times. A new level of prayer will be needed.


